Introduction

- 1. We are at war!
 - a. Not a fleshly war but a spiritual one (Eph. 6:12; 2 Cor. 10:3-4).
 - b. We have an enemy that must be resisted (1 Pt. 5:8-9; Jm. 4:4, 7).
 - c. We have a triumphant Commander (Heb. 2:9-15).
 - d. We have our marching orders (Col. 3:17).
- 2. The final area we will examine in this series on "Clear Christianity" is to be free from entanglement.
 - a. Not free from conflict, suffering, or trouble (Ac. 14:22).
 - b. Free from being entangled, trapped, or snared by the devil (1 Cor. 10:12-13).

I. War - A Time of Toil and Trouble

- 1. War is a time of conflict and hostility.
 - a. We cannot remain neutral (Jm. 4:4; 1 Jn. 2:15-17).
 - b. We cannot be on both sides (Mt. 6:24).
 - c. We must stand and fight (Eph. 6:10-13).
- 2. Persecution will come to the godly (2 Tim. 3:12).
 - a. Why? Because evil men and seducers are getting worse (2 Tim. 3:13; cf. 1 Tim. 4:1-5).

II. A Good Soldier Endures (2 Timothy 2:3)

- 1. The good soldier must endure hardness.
 - a. endure hardness (kakopatheo G2553 verb, imperative) this is a command! It is translated as "suffer trouble" (2 Tim. 2:9) and "endure afflictions" (2 Tim. 4:5).
 - b. It is possible for a soldier to desert or go AWOL due to the sufferings of war.
- 2. The good soldier of Jesus Christ must endure hardness.
 - a. a...soldier (stratiotes G4757 noun) used 26 times in the New Testament.
 - b. Hardship and suffering come with the territory in war.

III. A Good Soldier is Focused (2 Timothy 2:4)

- 1. To be a good soldier in the army the focus must be on the mission.
 - a. that warreth (*strateuo* G4754 verb, present) "to do military duty, be on active service, be a soldier" (Thayer 590).
 - b. entangleth himself (*empleko* G1707 verb, present) "to weave in' (*en*, 'in,' *pleko*, 'to weave'), hence, metaphorically, to be involved, entangled in" (Vine vol. 2 pp. 202-203).
 - c. The soldier's singular concern is what is happening on the battlefield.
 - d. I must watch my step for Satan's traps (Eph. 5:1-18).
- 2. The good soldier has one mission and that is to please him who has chosen him to be a soldier.
 - a. The Him is God and the choosing took place by the gospel (2 Th. 2:13-14).
 - b. I must look to the Commander who finished His mission and pleased His Father (Jn. 8:29, 17:4, 19:30).

Conclusion

- 1. Let us make sure we are fighting for God and not against Him.
- 2. Let us never give up or surrender to Satan.
- 3. Let us be aware of the devil's tactics and traps and avoid them.
- 4. God has given us the victory through the Lord Jesus Christ (1 Cor. 15:57).
