Introduction

- Lesson text: Psalm 100
- 1. We have entered into the season of thanksgiving.
 - a. This is a strong Biblical principle.
 - Hundreds of Bible passages deal with thanksgiving in some form or fashion.
 - c. The book of Psalms is overflowing with thanksgiving.
- 2. There are three commandments found in Psalm 100:4 and they are all centered around thanksgiving to God.

I. Enter

- 1. God said to "Enter into" (Ps. 100:4).
 - a. This is a verb or **action** word.
 - b. This means we must **do** something.
 - c. Christianity is an **action** religion (Mt. 7:21-23).
- 2. Observe whose gates and courts they are we are to enter into.
 - a. "His gates" and "His courts" (Ps. 100:4).
 - b. All that we are and have is because of the grace of God (1 Cor. 15:10).
 - c. He owns everything (<u>Ps. 24:1</u>, <u>50:10-12</u>).

II. Be Thankful

- 1. Few things are worse than an ungrateful person.
 - a. Being ungrateful displays a lack of respect for others (<u>Gal. 5:13-15</u>; cf. <u>Php. 2:3</u>).
 - b. Being ungrateful shows a prideful attitude (Php. 2:3; Pr. 16:18; cf. Rm. 12:10, 16).
 - c. Being ungrateful exhibits a dangerous ignorance or misunderstanding of reality (Ac. 14:15-17, 17:24-28).
 - d. Being ungrateful only leads to sin (Rm. 1:20ff).
- 2. In everything we are to give thanks (<u>1 Th. 5:18</u>; <u>Eph. 5:20</u>).
 - a. Our lifestyle should be full of thanksgiving (Eph. 5:1-4).
 - b. We should abound in thanksgiving to God (Col. 2:7).
- 3. How do we express our thanksgiving to God?
 - a. By our worship.

- b. By our personal devotions (Rm. 1:8; cf. 1 Cor. 1:4).
- 4. For what should we be thankful?
 - a. Our physical needs being provided (<u>1 Tim. 4:3-5</u>).
 - b. Our spiritual needs being provided (Ps. 119:62; Eph. 1:3).
 - c. Everything at all times (Eph. 5:20).
- 5. Why should we be thankful?
 - a. God made us (Ps. 100:3; cf. Gen. 1:26-31).
 - b. We are His sheep (<u>Ps. 100:3</u>; cf. <u>Jn. 10</u>).
 - c. God is good and His mercy endures forever (<u>Ps. 100:5</u>; cf. <u>Ps. 106:1</u>, <u>107:1</u>, <u>118:1</u>, <u>29</u>, <u>136:1</u>).
 - d. God's holiness is reason to be thankful to Him (Ps. 30:4, 97:12).
 - e. It is a good thing to give thanks to the LORD (Ps. 92:1).

III. Bless

- 1. Associated with thanksgiving is praise (blessing) to God (Ps. 100:4).
 - a. God is worthy to be praised (Ps. 18:3).
 - b. God is greatly to be praised (Ps. 48:1, 96:4).
- 2. We should praise God's name at all times (Ps. 113:3).
 - a. Remember, "the LORD *is* good; his mercy *is* everlasting; and his truth endureth to all generations" (Ps. 100:5).
 - b. He created us (Ps. 100:3)!
 - c. He created everyone and everything (Ps. 148:1-6)!
 - d. His name alone is excellent (Ps. 148:7-13).
 - e. Praise ye the LORD (<u>Ps. 148:14</u>).
- 3. All spiritual blessings are found in Christ and this is cause for blessing God (Eph. 1:3).
 - a. We have redemption through His Son (Eph. 1:4-7).
 - b. This redemption brings about praise and glory to God (Eph. 1:12-14).
