- 1. One of the most tragic things on Earth is being ungrateful.
  - a. It has led and continues to lead to all types of wickedness (Rm. 1:18-32).
- 2. Being thankful for everything is the will of God (1 Th. 5:18).
  - a. He has commanded it (Col. 3:17).

# I. Thankful People

- 1. Thankful for God Himself as He is worthy (Rev. 7:12, 4:8-11; cf. Jm. 1:17).
  - a. Thankful for our existence (Ac. 17:28).
  - b. Thankful for the many blessings God bestows on us each day (Mt. 5:45, Ac. 14:17).
- 2. Thankful for each other and remember the work of faith, labor of love, and patience of hope we share (1 Th. 1:2-4; cf. Col. 1:3-5; 2 Th. 1:3-4).
- 3. Thankful to serve (<u>1 Tim. 1:12</u>).
- 4. Thankful for Christ and the victory through and in Him (1 Cor. 15:57; 2 Cor. 2:14).
- 5. Thankful for the reception of God's Word (1 Th. 2:13).
- 6. Thankful when one obeys the Gospel (Rm. 6:17-18).
  - a. This causes more thanksgiving for the one who obeys (Col. 1:12-14).

# II. Thankful Prayers

- 1. Keep prayer and thanksgiving regular (Col. 4:2).
- 2. Interrupt anxiety with prayer and thanksgiving (Php. 4:6).

## **III. Thankful Protection**

- 1. Only wrath awaits the unthankful (Rm. 1:18-21).
  - a. Death is the final result (Rm. 1:32; cf. Rm. 6:23).
- 2. If our mouths are full of thanksgiving, they will not be full of sin (Eph. 5:1-4).
- 3. This is why we must grow (abound) in thanksgiving (Col. 2:7).
