

I. God the Father is Holy

1. Mary's magnification of the Lord showed His holiness ([Lk. 1:49](#)).
 - a. Indeed, God's name is holy ([Ps. 111:9](#); cf. [Mt. 6:9](#); [Lk. 11:2](#)).
 - b. We must not take it in vain ([Jm. 5:12](#); cf. [Ex. 20:7](#); [Lev. 19:12](#)).
2. The high and holy prayer of Jesus to the Father showed His holiness ([Jn. 17:11](#)).
3. Peter stated God is holy ([1 Pt. 1:16](#); cf. [Lev. 11:44-45](#)).
4. The Revelation of Jesus Christ showed God is holy ([Rev. 4:8](#)).

II. God the Son is Holy

1. The Son of God was called holy before His conception ([Lk. 1:35](#)).
2. Jesus led a perfect life untainted by sin and was called the Holy One ([Ac. 3:14](#)).
 - a. He is the perfectly holy High Priest ([Heb. 7:26-28](#)).
 - b. God set Jesus apart for the Messianic office ([Ac. 4:26-30](#)).

III. God the Spirit is Holy

1. The third person of the Godhead is called the Holy Spirit.
 - a. He was instrumental in the conception of Jesus which fulfilled Scripture ([Mt. 1:18-23](#)).
 - b. He is God, He is holy, and He must be treated as such ([Ac. 5:3-4](#)).
2. The Holy Spirit inspired holy men to pen the Holy Scriptures ([2 Pt. 1:20-21](#); [Eph. 3:1-5](#); cf. [Ps. 138:2](#)).
 - a. We need the Holy Scriptures to know that God is holy and thus be holy ourselves.
 - b. The Holy Scriptures are all-sufficient for this purpose ([2 Tim. 3:16-17](#); [2 Pt. 1:3](#)).
