Let God Be True

We all realize that Jesus was God in the flesh (John 1:1-14). As such we know that He cannot lie, for God "cannot lie" (Titus 1:2). The very thought that Jesus would not be truthful is in and of itself repugnant to most. Sadly though, the conclusion must be reached that many say He was in fact a liar, that He did not tell the truth in the things recorded in the Bible. No, people will not openly use the term "lie" in speaking of Him, but nonetheless the charge is still true. Webster's New Collegiate Dictionary defines lie very simply as "to make an untrue statement." Now if we look to the Scriptures and find statements that the Lord either said or endorsed, and then do not believe them (that is, we teach and or follow doctrines contrary to them), we must of necessity be saying that Jesus was saying something we deem to be "untrue." Thus by our actions and teaching, we call Him a liar. For example, following you will find several statements which Jesus made as recorded in the Bible. Below each of them are statements representing prominent doctrines in

the religious world. Mark the one which you believe and teach to be true to see if you are, by your religious teachings, denying the truth of Jesus' words.

Did Jesus tell the truth when He spoke of the completion of revelation, "all truth," would be given in the days of the apostles?

Which statement below is true?

T F Howbeit when he, the Spirit of truth, is come, he will guide you into <u>all truth</u>: for he shall not speak of himself; but whatsoever he shall hear, that shall he speak: and he will show you things to come. Jesus Christ, John 16:13

or

T F None of the biblical authors had any idea of writing a book which would of itself give us all of God's revelation. . . . God's revelation, then, is something that is happening to God's people today. . ..

Which statement below is true?

Did Jesus tell the truth when He said one must be baptized in order to be saved?

Which statement below is true?

T F He that believeth <u>and is</u> <u>baptized</u> shall be saved; but he that believeth not shall be damned.
